POSITION ROUND NOTES:

- Heading into the position round match, Bill O'Neill led Mike Scroggins by 21 pins for the No. 1 seed. With 30 bonus pins going to the winner, whoever won this match would be the No. 1 seed. Scroggins beat O'Neill, 227-185, to take over the No. 1 seed for today's show.
- Heading into the position round match, Tommy Jones was basically locked into third place. However, he beat Jason Belmonte, 203-190, and Belmonte's 190 game dropped him from fourth to sixth.
- Walter Ray Williams Jr. was fifth heading into position round, only 23 pins behind Belmonte. Norm Duke was sixth, 39 pins out of fourth, and Jason Couch was seventh, 49 pins off the show.
- Couch struck out in the 10th frame of his match to beat Pete Weber, 214-190, earning 30 bonus pins for the win.
- Duke struck on his last five shots to post a 201 score vs. Williams Jr. Williams Jr. needed to double in the 10th and get at least seven pins on his "fill ball" to defeat Duke and earn the 30 bonus pins he needed to stay ahead of Couch. Williams got the double, but then got 6 on his final shot. That resulted in a tie match with Duke at 201 and only 15 bonus pins for Williams Jr. (instead of the 30 he would have gotten for a win). That allowed Couch to move past Williams Jr. by two pins into the fourth and final spot on the show.

THIS WEEK IN THE LUMBER LIQUIDATORS PBA TOUR NOTES**HISTORY OF THE U.S. OPEN**

- The origins of the U.S. Open are in the BPAA All-Star event, which began in 1942 and continued through 1970. That event became the U.S. Open in 1971.
- The first winner of the BPAA All-Star was John Crimmons who defeated Joe Norris in 1942. Both bowlers were from Detroit.
- Both Don Carter (1953, '54, '57 & '58) and Dick Weber (1962, '63, '65 & '66) won the BPAA All-Star a record four times.

- The first U.S. Open, contested in 1971 in St. Paul, MN, was won by Mike Limongello (eventual PBA Hall of Fame inductee). It marked the first time a stepladder finals was used to decide the championship and that format has remained in existence to this day (with the exception of the 1998 event which used a bracket format for the TV finals).
- Pete Weber is the only bowler to have won the U.S. Open four times (1988, 1991, 2004 & 2007).
- The 1987 U.S. Open, won by Del Ballard Jr., marked the first time a PBA event featured a six-figure first-place check. Ballard took home \$100,000 for this win. The U.S. Open featured a \$100,000 first-place prize from 1987-1989 and again from 2003-2009.
- ► Mike Scroggins is looking to become just the second player to successfully defend a U.S. Open title. Dave Husted, who won the 1995 U.S. Open in Detroit, MI, and defended his title in 1996 here in Indianapolis, is the only player to have accomplished this feat since this event became the U.S. Open in 1971.
- ► Mike Scroggins and ► Tommy Jones are each trying to become just the sixth player to win multiple U.S. Open titles. Five players have won multiple U.S. Open titles and five players have won multiple BPAA All-Star titles. They are listed below (U.S. Open winners in bold).

THE PBA IN INDIANAPOLIS

This week's event marks the 32nd Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour event held in Indianapolis, and the 27th held at Woodland Bowl. The center played host to a Tour stop 20 consecutive seasons from 1981-2001 and, after a year off, has returned for the past seven seasons. This season marks the fourth time this center has hosted the U. S. Open (1990, 1991 & 1996). In addition to the four U.S. Opens contested here, there have been five other "major" championships contested at Woodland Bowl: 2006 & 2008 PBA World Championship and 1992, 1993 & 1994 Touring Players Championship.

The first PBA Tour event held in Indianapolis was the Indianapolis Open at Play Bowl which was won by Billy Welu. Play Bowl also hosted the inaugural PBA Tournament of Champions that same year (won by Joe Joseph). After three events at Play Bowl, one at Raceway Lanes and another at Astro Bowl, the Tour kicked off its 20-year run at Woodland Bowl with the 1981 Kessler Classic won by Wayne Webb.

MIKE SCROGGINS AS NO. 1 SEED IN STEPLADDER FINALS

Mike Scroggins is 1-1 with a 202.00 average all-time as the No. 1 seed in a stepladder finals format. His opponents are averaging 202.00 against him in these title matches.

--Scroggins lost the 1995 Hilton Hotels Classic in Reno, NV, to Justin Hromek as the No. 1 seed, 213-190.

--Scroggins won the 2008 Pepsi Championship in Omaha, NE, vs. Walter Ray Williams Jr. as the No. 1 seed, 214-191.

U.S. OPEN SEEDS IN TITLE MATCHES

The U.S. Open has been contested in a stepladder format every since 1971 (with the exception of 1997 and 2002 when the event was not contested and 1998 when a bracket format was used). Here are the results of the various seeds in the title matches for those stepladder finals.

--The No. 1 seed has lost the last four U.S. Open title matches (2006-2009) after having won the previous six title matches (1999-2005, event not contested in 2002). That is the longest winning streak for No. 1 seeds in this event. The longest losing streak for No. 1 seeds in this event is five from (1978-1982). A loss by the No. 1 seed today would equal that streak.

-- The last time a bowler seeded No. 4 or lower won a U.S. Open was Pete Weber in 1991 (Indianapolis).

PERFECT IN MATCH PLAY

Mike Scroggins was a perfect 4-0 in match play this week vs. the other three players on today's telecast. He defeated Bill O'Neill twice (including the position round) and Tommy Jones and Jason Couch once each.

LOOKING FOR THIRD MAJOR

Mike Scroggins is looking for his third major win since the fall of 2005 when he captured the USBC Masters in Milwaukee, WI. He also won this event last season.

COMING FROM WAY BACK

After the first round of qualifying in this event (six games), Bill O'Neill was in 185th place with an average of 188.83. O'Neill came alive in the second round of qualifying as he averaged 242.83 for those six games to go from 185th to 13th.

NOT SO PERFECT IN MATCH PLAY

While Mike Scroggins was busy beating all the other finalists in match play this week, Bill O'Neill had a much rougher go of it, losing all four of his matches to the other finalists on today's telecast. He lost twice to Scroggins (including the position round match) and once each to Tommy Jones & Jason Couch.

SEEKING FIRST MAJOR

Bill O'Neill is the only player on today's telecast without a win in a "major." His best major finish came earlier this season when he finished third in the PBA World Championship. His best U.S. Open finish was 13th in 2008 in North Brunswick, NJ.

BEST ON TV . . . BUT STRUGGLING LATELY

Tommy Jones' TV winning percentage of .755% (34-11) is the best in PBA history. However, Jones has struggled on TV lately, losing his last three matches on TV. Jones last won on TV in March of 2008 when he won three matches en route to the title in the GEICO Classic in West Babylon, NY.

SUCCESS AT WOODLAND BOWL

Jason Couch is no stranger to success in this bowling center. He has made two telecasts in this bowling center and has won the title in both of them. In 1993, Jason won his first "major" by capturing the Touring Players Championship at Woodland Bowl. He also won the 1995 Indianapolis Open here. The only other player of today's finalists to have made a telecast in this center is Bill O'Neill, who finished fourth in last season's Etonic Marathon Open held here.

LOOKING FOR REDEMPTION

Jason Couch is looking for redemption in the U.S. Open. He finished second in his only previous U.S. Open telecast in 1999 to Bob Learn Jr., losing the title match of the event held at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, CT, 231-215.
