### **LANE PATTERN:**

**Length:** 39 ft.

**Description:** The Dick Weber Pattern is designed to maximize creativity and performance from the world's best bowlers. This 39-foot pattern allows for a greater buffing distance, resulting in less oil placed at the end of the pattern. The result of this design is a lane pattern in constant transition requiring bowlers to make significant adjustments and to use their creativity in attacking the pattern from lane to lane. These performance qualities were the hallmarks of the great career of Dick Weber.

### ***Format:***

- Event started with 156 bowlers. 138 bowlers did not have byes and 18 bowlers (3 in each region) had byes.
- Event consists of six regions -- 24 bowlers (plus 3 seeded bowlers) in the East Region; 23 bowlers (plus 3 seeded bowlers), in the East, Midwest, South and Southwest Regions; 22 bowlers (plus 3 seeded bowlers) in the West/Northwest Region.
- During this event, bowlers were only competing against the other bowlers in their region.
- All non-seeded bowlers bowled 15 games of qualifying.
  - Cut to the top 9 bowlers in each region who advanced to Round Two and were joined by a seeded player (13-18 on the PBA Tour Point List).
- Those 10 bowlers bowled 6 games of qualifying.
  - Cut to the top 7 bowlers in each region who advanced to Round Three and were joined by a seeded player (7-12 on the PBA Tour Point List).
- Those 8 bowlers bowled 6 games of qualifying.
  - Cut to the Top 5 bowlers in each region who advanced to Round Four and were joined by a seeded player (1-6 on the PBA Tour Point List)
- Those 6 bowlers bowled 6 games of qualifying.
  - Cut to the Top 4 bowlers in each region who advanced to the Round Five.
- Those 4 bowlers bowled 6 games of qualifying.
  - Cut to the Top 3 bowlers in each region who advanced to today's telecasts.

## THIS WEEK IN THE LUMBER LIQUIDATORS PBA TOUR NOTES

### DICK WEBER CAREER NOTES

- Born Dec. 23, 1929, in Indianapolis, IN.
- Moved to the St. Louis area in 1955.
- Voted the third greatest player in PBA history.
- Won 30 PBA Tour titles (7th all-time) and six PBA Senior Tour titles.
- Won four BPAA All-Star titles – 1962, '63, '65 & '66 (predecessor to U.S. Open).
- Charter Member of the PBA.
- Inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1975 and USBC Hall of Fame in 1970.
- Won PBA titles in six different decades (50s, 60s, 70s, 80s, 90s & 2000s).
- 1965 PBA Player of the Year.
- Three-time BPAA Bowler of the Year (1961, '63 & '65).
- He and son Pete are the only father-son tandem in the PBA Hall of Fame.
- Died Feb. 13, 2005.

### THE PBA IN INDIANAPOLIS

This week's event marks the 33rd Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour event held in Indianapolis, and the 28th held at Woodland Bowl. This center played host to a Tour stop 20 consecutive seasons from 1981-2001 and, after a year off, has returned for the past eight seasons. This center has hosted the U. S. Open four times (1990, 1991, 1996 & 2010). In addition to the four U.S. Opens contested here, there have been five other "major" championships contested at Woodland Bowl: 2006 & 2008 PBA World Championship and 1992, 1993 & 1994 Touring Players Championship.

The first PBA Tour event held in Indianapolis was the Indianapolis Open at Play Bowl which was won by Billy Welu in 1962. Play Bowl also hosted the inaugural PBA Tournament of Champions that same year (won by Joe Joseph). After three events at Play Bowl, one at Raceway Lanes and another at Astro Bowl, the Tour kicked off its 20-year run at Woodland Bowl with the 1981 Kessler Classic won by Wayne Webb.



### **BACK-TO-BACK AT WOODLAND BOWL?**

Bill O'Neill won the last Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour event here at Woodland Bowl, which was last season's Lumber Liquidators U.S. Open. The last player to win consecutive seasons in the same venue was Chris Barnes in Columbus, OH, in 2008 and 2009.

### **LOOKING FOR MULTIPLE WINS**

No player has won more than one title this season, but four players have a chance to win their second title of the season in this event (Chris Barnes, Scott Norton, Bill O'Neill and Mika Koivuniemi).

### **STREAKING**

Walter Ray Williams Jr. is trying to extend his tour record streak of winning at least one title per season to 18.

### **STREAKING . . . PART II**

Both Walter Ray Williams Jr. and Steve Jaros extended streaks with their TV appearance today . . . Williams Jr. has now made at least one TV appearance in 26 consecutive seasons (starting in 1985) and Steve Jaros extended his streak to 20 consecutive (starting with the year he made his first TV appearance . . . 1991).
