DEFENDING CHAMPION

Defending champion Scott Norton, who won the 2013 Earl Anthony Players Championship in Allen Park, MI, finished 12th in this year's event.

DIFFERENT SURFACES

Qualifying and match play in this event took place at AMF Bowlero Lanes in Wauwatosa, WI (suburban Milwaukee) and the lane surface there was synthetic surface (AMF HPL). The surface here at Woodland Bowl is also synthetic, but a different type (Brunswick Pro Anvilane).

BOHN CAN TIE ROTH ON ALL-TIME WINS LIST

A win today by Parker Bohn III, which would be his first since winning the 2012 PBA World Championship in Las Vegas, would give Bohn 34 career PBA wins and would tie him with Mark Roth for fifth place on the PBA's all-time wins list.

BOHN AND DUKE IMPRESSIVE ON PBA5O TOUR

While Parker Bohn III and Norm Duke both had limited success on the PBA Tour in 2014 (neither made a TV Finals appearance and neither earned more than \$30,000), both players enjoyed success on the PBA50 Tour. Bohn won his first career PBA50 Tour title with a win in the PBA50 Miller High Life Classic in Mooresville, NC. Duke was even more impressive on the "senior circuit" as he won twice, including his first PBA50 "major" at the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open, and earned both PBA50 Rookie and Player of the Year honors.

RUSSELL COMING OFF STELLAR 2014 SEASON

Ronnie Russell is riding the momentum from a 2014 season that was his best ever. Russell made four TV finals in 2014 (the most in his career in a single season), won his second career title (PBA Bear Open in Shawnee, OK) and finished in the Top 10 in all three major statistical categories (10th in earnings, 7th in average and 4th in points) for the first time in his career.

BELMONTE ON A TV WINNING STREAK

With his win at the 2015 USBC Masters, Jason Belmonte extended his winning streak on TV to 11 in a row. The streak started with his win in the 2014 Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions and continued as he won the 2014 USBC Masters, the 2014 PBA Oklahoma Open and the 2015 USBC Masters. His last loss on TV came in the 2013 PBA Viper Challenge when he finished fourth after losing to Stuart Williams. The record for consecutive wins on TV is 16 set by Jim Pencak from 1989-91.

DUKE CAN BREAK TIE WITH WEBER

A win today by Norm Duke would be the 38th of his career and would break a tie with Pete Weber and move Duke into sole possession of third place on the PBA's all-time wins list behind only Walter Ray Williams Jr. (47) and Earl Anthony (43).

DAUGHERTY MAKES FIRST TV FINALS OUTSIDE OF VEGAS

Tom Daugherty makes his first TV Finals appearance today in an event not contested in Las Vegas. His first career TV Finals appearance came in the 2011 PBA Tournament of Champions where he set PBA records for lowest score on TV (100) and largest margin of defeat (199 pins) in losing the semifinal match to Mika Koivuniemi, 299-100. His only other TV appearance also came in Vegas, but had a much better result as he won the 2012 Bowlers Journal Scorpion Championship. Daugherty defeated Jason Sterner, Jason Belmonte and, in the title match, Osku Palermaa to claim his first PBA Tour title.

FOUR OF FIVE FINALISTS HAVE BOWLED 300 ON TV

Parker Bohn III, Ronnie Russell, Jason Belmonte and Norm Duke have all rolled 300 games on TV. Additionally, Bohn and Belmonte have each had a 300 game rolled against them on TV (it's happened to Bohn twice).

PARKER BOHN III AS NO. 1 SEED IN STEPLADDER FINALS

Parker Bohn III has qualified as the No. 1 seed for a stepladder finals an astounding 28 times, with a 16-12 record and an average of 223.88 (his opponents have averaged 225.31). Most recently as the No. 1 seed, Bohn lost to Wes Malott in the title match of the 2013 PBA Cheetah Championship in Las Vegas. His last win from the No. 1 seed came in the 2008 Cheetah Championship in Cheektowaga, NY.

TOP SEED IN STEPLADDER FINALS (THROUGH 2014 SEASON)

There were only 7 events in the 2014 season featuring a stepladder finals (Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions, USBC Masters, PBA Wolf, Bear, Badger & Oklahoma Opens & PBA World Championship). In those 7 events, the No. 1 seed went 2-5 in the title match. In the 2012-13 season, there were 21 events with a stepladder finals format and No. 1 seeds went 8-13 in those title matches. No. 1 seeds have not had a winning record in title matches since the 2008-09 season when they went 7-6. Results for the top seed in recent years of stepladder finals is below:
