

Each student will have an opportunity to specialize in a area of bowling. This course requires deep though into the sport of bowling. Not every bowler can be a Walter Ray Williams Jr., but they can specialize in an area. This course teaches the students on how to be Bowlologist in each area of bowling. Students have the opportunity to take the Master of the Lanes exam. A score of 720 out of 900 is considered a Bowlologist. Students must complete a project involving their specialty area. Master of the Lanes exam will count towards 50% of their grade with 40% from the project. Students will have access to the professor the course, JoshHydeBowling@gmail.com for questions and conversation.

John Jowdy knew how to work with a player and get them back to striking. Chuck Pezzano knew the history of the sport and was one of the founding members of the PBA.

A Bowlologist is someone who studies the sport of bowling at a professional level in all aspects of the field such as playing the lanes, coaching, running a tournament, operating a pro-shop, designing a ball, being an ambassador to the sport and knowing the history of the sport and being able to write about it. Being able to take an elite level of understanding the sport of bowling is imperative if a person wants to a Bowlologist. The individuals pictured above represent a particular aspect of the sport and along with many others had a big impact on the sport of bowling. They knew their craft in the bowling world. These individuals knew what it took to make bowling what it is today. Entering this class is the highest honor in the Bowlology Academy.

Bowling Equipment

Throughout the last 50 years, bowling equipment has changed drastically. Bowling manufacturers have changed the cores of the ball, the ball, and the cover stock along with the layout. Pro-Shop Operators have been learning how to improve bowlers' averages just by laying out a ball differently. When weight holes were allowed, Pro-Shop Operators and bowlers could talk amongst themselves to get a better ball reaction. Even the lanes have been changed from wood to lacquer to urethane to synthetic. The bowling industry has made a tool called a rock. This tool will tell the lane mechanic how much friction is on the lane. The pins have changed from maple wood to synthetic pins which has drastically altered the scoring environment.



United States Bowling Congress

Before 1895 Bowling was not an organized sport. A bowler could bowl in Detroit on a 30-foot lane and then go to Chicago and bowl on a 60-foot lane. The need for an organization was evident with the chaotic state of sport of bowling. On September 9th in New York that organization was founded as the American Bowling Congress. In this meeting they set standards for each bowling association across the country. This was the beginning of making bowling into a sport.

ABC established such standards as from the foul line to the headpin. The ball had to be 27 inches in circumference. The pins had to be 12 inches apart. A perfect game was 300.

They also established various awards for excellence in bowling. The first USBC National Championship was in 1901 where the ABC constructed six lanes in Chicago.







BPAA

In 1932 a group of Bowling Center Proprietor's. They needed an organization of their own. The first slogan adopted was "united we prosper". Nine years later the BPAA hosted a tournament for the top bowlers of the country called the BPAA All-Star currently known as the US Open. Dick Weber and Don Carter would claim four all star tournaments each. This organization was for the proprietors who wanted to learn more the business side of bowling. Before the PBA the bowling proprietors would host television shows such as Make That Spare, Jack Pot Bowling, and Championship Bowling. Ed <u>Lubanski</u> was the first bowler to shoot two perfect games on National Television. Steve Nagy was the first bowler to shoot a 300 game on National Television.



Bowling History

Bowling's origins date to 3,200 BC in ancient Egypt. In Europe during the early days of bowling, it was called skittles. The king Edward II in 1366 outlawed bowling so his army would stay focused on practicing archery for battle instead of bowling for amusement. Bowling or nine pins was banned in the US in some places because of the gambling that went with the game. It was at this time bowling that bowling only had nine pins. Bowling centers would give out turkeys to any bowler who bowled three strikes in a row. The perfect game was known as a golden turkey. In 1845 Brunswick was founded as the world's oldest bowling company. Up until 1905 bowling balls were made of wood when the first rubber ball was introduced the Ever true. Bowlers would use only two holes in their balls instead of three. The automatic pin setter machine was invented in 1906 and patented in 1941. AMF introduced a prototype to the general public in 1946 at an America Bowling Congress tournament but these did not really arrive at the lanes until 1956 when the Brunswick company introduced them to bowling centers.

In 1913 a bowling publication came out called the Bowler's Journal. It is the oldest bowling publication in North America. It is still in existence today. The magazine covers the bowling news of the day. In the Open Championships. The Bowler's Journal would host a five-game sweeper tournament with each participant receiving a subscription. The magazine was founded by Dave Luby.







Top Professional Bowling Tournaments

A Bowlologist evaluates tournaments both professional and amateur — whether there is a local \$1,000 first place guarantee scratch tournament or the greatest tournament of them all - the U.S. Open on the PBA Tour. Jason Belmonte has the most Majors and has won all of them at least once. He completed the Super Slam at the 2020 U.S. Open. Pete Weber won ten Majors over four decades. Walter Ray Williams, Jr. had the most PBA Tour Titles. Earl Anthony had ten Majors and forty-three PBA Tour Titles. He would also win the PBA World Championship six times, three-peating the tournament twice. Norm Duke would be the third bowler to win forty PBA Tour Titles.



Bowlology Pillars

Being able to identify a bowler's problems - such as how they are standing and where their finish position is, a Bowlologist can identify what is wrong with a bowler's form. John Jowdy was a legendry coach who helped a multitude of top name bowlers on the PBA Tour. Now today, it is Mark Baker. Mark Baker helped Chris Barnes and Tommy Jones advance their game to a whole new level. The Joe Bowlers of today want to throw the ball like Jason Belmonte. A good coach will turn a player's liabilities into an asset. The top 100 coaches in Bowler's Journal can identify a bowler's liabilities and abilities to make their game better. This is not basic bowling. It is advanced bowling. Jakob Buttruff has finished second at the U.S. Open three times. As for Francois Lavoie, he has won three Majors - two of them being U.S. Opens.

KingPin Associates is one of the ways that make their own ideas and forms to help other bowlers. Francois Lavoie has the most ideal bowling style on the approach, whereas, Jakob Buttruff has an unorthodox approach yet still has consistent results at the end of the approach.





PBA -Pinnacle of Bowling

Bowling has a number of different opportunities in addition to being a pro bowler. There are bowling center proprietors, pro-shop operators, coaches, and ball designers.. The PBA is the pinnacle of bowling. The PBA has Regional Programs (different satellite tournaments) both in the U.S. as well as Japan. However, the PBA does not have a championship for each of the regions. The PBA World Championship is like the USBC Open Championship. Earl Anthony has won six PBA World/National Championships. Eddie Elias talked with the best bowlers at the 1958 USBC Masters which was the starting point for getting the PBA founded. He asked 33 bowlers who were the charter members to put up \$50 apiece. Eddie's dream was coming true. Dick Weber, Don Carter, Carmen Salvino, Harry (The Tiger) Smith and Ray Bluth were some of the founding members. The first tournament was held in 1959. Lou "Wrongfoot" Campi would win the first one and Dick Weber would win twice. In 1960, Don Carter would win the inaugural PBA (National) World Championship. PBA Membership would grow over the years. At its height, there were 10,000 members.











Bowlologist Tools of the Trade









These are the tool of the trade for a Bowlologist. The tools help measure different aspects of the sport of bowling and help a Bowlologist become a specialist in the field of Bowlology.

What is a Bowlologist Firm?

A Bowlologist firm is a company in which bowlers and bowling fans can obtain information regarding the sport of bowling. If a bowler wants to improve their game, they can do some research on Bowlology and find the topic that will help them improve their game. If a bowling fan wants to know the likelihood of a pro-bowler winning a tournament, they can study the Strike Column in Josh Hyde's Bowling Newsletter. Bowling fans and bowlers also have an opportunity to review data of different professional and amateur tournaments. Bowling Tournament Analysis, both pro and amateur, can provide a resource for bowlers or bowling fans as to what the scoring environment was in a particular tournament. Bowlology Academy Internship Project

After a student has passed all of the Bowlology Academy courses, they will have an internship project in one of the of several fields discussed during the coursework. They will also learn the B.A.I.L. skillset for becoming a Bowling Analyst Industry Leader which is the final stage of the Bowlologist program.

<u>Tournament Director</u>— an intern would talk with a proprietor about the lineage per game or per bowler and the format of the tournament. It is a tournament director's initiative to understand that a bowling center might have a birthday party. The proprietor needs to understand that the lanes need to be challenging or easy depending on what the tournament director's goal is.

<u>Pro-Shop Operator</u>— an intern would learn how to use the various types of equipment at the pro-shop for customizing a player's balls. They would also learn how to put in an Interchangeable Switch Grip.

<u>Ball Designer</u>— an intern would meet with an industry ball designer to learn the process of a designing with the CAD program and how cover stocks are made.

<u>Coaching</u>— an intern would be an assistant coach to someone who is teaching a high school team, league players, or professional bowlers. They would learn how to teach one hander/two hander bowlers, lane play,

<u>Bowler</u>– an intern would gain real experience by bowing in PBA Regionals, Scratch tournaments, and several league nights on house and sports shot patterns.

<u>Bowling Writer</u>– an intern would write up stories on local, regional or national bowling tournaments and submit them for evaluation and publication.

There will be a Bowling Industry Analysis Project that must be completed by all graduates. Students must complete a project on how all aspects of the bowling industry work together toward the goal of improving the sport for bowlers of all skill levels and fans of the sport.
