Messenger Rash wins title 17

Sean Rash won his 17th PBA Tour Title at the Chesapeake Open by defeating Tom Daugherty 228 to 212. Rash struck in the tenth to win his 17th title. In the Semi-Finals, Sean Rash took on PBA Hall of Famer Tommy Jones. Rash would defeat him 248 to 216.

Tommy would earn \$3,500. In the first match, Tommy would take on Ryan Ciminelli who came out of retirement. Jones would dispose of Ciminelli 250 to 202.

Daugherty would lead qualifying by averaging 250. His closest competitor was 36 pins behind. Kyle Troup needed to finish second to earn a half million dollars for a single season, but missed the cut. This was the final event in the Summer Swing

point race where bowlers were trying to earn \$20,000 for first prize. Darren Tang, Anthony Simonsen, Shawn Maldonado, and EJ Tackett were all looking for points. Jakob Butturff would take the final spot with a score of +125.





Bohn Wins PBA50 Dave Small's Championship Lanes Open

Parker Bohn III wins his sixth PBA50 title by defeating Tom Adcock 233 to 157 and he collected \$7,500 in prize money for his efforts. This was part of 9-day winning streak where he has won two PBA Regional titles along with "back-to-back PBA50 Tour titles". In the Semi-finals, he defeated PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke. Duke had missed two spares back-to-back and could never really get lined up. Bohn was surprised when Duke missed spares back-to-back. In the first Stepladder, Tom Hess met USBC Hall of Famer Lennie Boresch, Jr. and defeated him 226 to 181. In the next match, Tom Hess faced Parker Bohn III in a close match. He was confident that bowling 200 games were going to get the job done. Parker commented "I have won 10 matches in a row in a Stepladder format and I've surpassed cloud nine. It's just unbelievable."

In the preliminary rounds of the PBA50 Dave Small Championship Lanes, Adock lapsed the field. Walter Ray Williams Jr, Amleto Monacelli, PBA50 Rookie of the Year Eugene McCune and USBC Hall of Famer Tim Mack were the other names that were in the top 32. Walter Ray Williams Jr had been injured but came back and only missed the Stepladder by 20 pins. Amleto missed the cut by 76 pins preventing him from reaching the Stepladder finals. The Stepladder finals had a 9-3 record in the Match play portion of the tournament winning 75% of the matches. This was Parker Bohn III's second title at the Dave Small's Championship Lanes. Former PBA Rookie of the Year Ryan Schafer made Match play but fell a little short of seeking his first PBA50 title. On the first day of qualifying, Parker Bohn III averaged 236 for his seven games. On the second day of qualifying, he was struggling but he managed to still qualify for the Match play. Tom Adcock was in the top three the entire tournament.






83rd Bowlers Journal All-American Team

Kyle Troup became the Captain of 83rd Bowlers Journal All-American Team for the men. He won the 2021 PBA Player's Championship. The top players of the 2020-2021 Team runs from last June to June of this year. Chris Via, Thomas Larsen, Francois Lavoie and Jason Belmonte are the other members of the team. Chris Via won the 2021 U.S. Open and became the 30th Player to bowl a perfect game on national television. Thomas Larsen won the 2021 USBC Masters, Francois Lavoie won the 2021 Tournament of Champions. Lavoie joined Sean Rash as becoming only the second bowler in PBA history to bowl two perfect games on national television at the 2020 PBA Playoffs. Jason Belmonte won multiple titles at the 2020 PBA World Series of Bowling. However, Jason Belmonte did not perform up to his standards at the 2021 PBA Majors.

On the female team, Julia Bond received the Captain's spot. The Bowlers Journal included the 2020 USBC Queens title and the winner was Julia Bond. Other bowlers included Dasha Kovalova, Stephanie Zavala, Shannon O' Keefe and Verity Crawley. Dasha had consecutive BowlTV final appearances and earned her third career PWBA Tour title. Shannon O' Keefe is a two time Player of the Year. This is the summary of the 2020-2021 Bowlers Journal All-American Team roster.



Commentary Josh Hyde Bowling Brand

A Bowling Firm is a company in which bowlers and bowling fans can obtain information regarding the sport of bowling. If a bowler wants to improve their game, they can do some research on Bowlology and find the topic that will help them improve their game. Bowling fans and bowlers also have an opportunity to review data from different professional and amateur tournaments. Below is an example of Josh Hyde's Bowling Foundation Frame.

There are seven services that make up the Josh Hyde Bowling Brand, as follows:

<u>Josh Hyde Bowling Newsletter (established June 2008)</u> - On Memorial Day weekend 2008, I wrote the first issue of the Josh Hyde Bowling Newsletter. It was a one-page issue. Now it is up to 6-pages covering both amateur and professional bowling and general bowling news.

<u>JoshHydeBowling.com (established Fall 2010)</u> - This website was first known as <u>probowlersuperfan.com</u>. Originally, it started out reporting about pro bowling on the PBA Tour. It now includes amateur tournaments.

Bowlology (established November 2011) - In November 2011, I wrote about "the perfect strike", then on to different bowling topics. As a result, I became fortunate enough to go through the USBC Coaching Program and earn the Bronze then Silver Coaching certificates.

<u>Bowl Frame Score (established December 2013)</u> - At the 2013 World Series of Bowling, the PBA created a statistic called Roll-Tech which measured strike-on-strike percentage. A 300 would get a 100% score. I created Bowl Frame Score which measured the strike-on-spare percentage.

<u>PBA Publications</u> - The 2012-13 Josh Hyde Bowling PBA Media Guide was created. The PBA ended their normal Media Guide, and I made one to replace it and continued the tradition. In 2015, I also made a Media kit for the 50th Anniversary of the Tournament of Champions.

Bowling Tournament Analysis - Bowling Tournament Analysis, both pro and amateur, can provide a resource for bowlers or bowling fans as to what the scoring environment was in a particular tournament.

Bowlology Academy (established January 2021) - This has four different levels that allow a bowler to increase their skills and knowledge of the sport.
