Messenger **Team Europe Wins 2021 Weber Cup**

This year's 2021 Weber Cup was a very close competition as it came down to the last frame in the last game to determine the champion. For the scoring system, it used the World Bowling scoring system. Each day there was a dominant team. On the first day, Team Europe made an opening statement with a 5-3 lead. On day two, Team USA made their run to go past Team Europe by 2 points, 9-7. On day three, Team USA solidified their lead with an additional point, 14-11. Going into the last day, Team USA saw their 3-point disappear, finally losing by 1 point to Team Europe, 18-17. It was back-and-forth tournament which came down to the wire with Svensson striking on the last ball.

The USA roster was made up of Chris Barnes (Captain), Chris Via (2021 US Open winner), Kyle Troup (2021 PBA Players Championship winner), Tom Daugherty (2021 PBA World Championship winner) and Anthony Simonsen. Team Europe was captained by Dominic Barrett. Rounding out the team roster was Jesper Svensson, Thomas Larsen (2021 USBC Masters winner), Richie Teece and Stuart Williams. Both Captains were participants at this year's Weber Cup. Team USA looked like the team to beat with most of the reigning Major champions of the PBA Tour. However, Team Europe pulled it out on the final day of the tournament.

Tackett wins the RPI -Central

EJ Tackett won the RPI in the Central Region. He defeated Joe Bailey 257 to 234. Since EJ was in the top 50 of the Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour in the points. He did not earn the spot into the upcoming RPI Tournament in January. Joe Bailey did not even get the entry into the RPI tournament. The entries went to Patrick Dombrowski, Michael Schlabach, and AJ Johnson. The scores were low as it took a just score of even by Jeremy Domingo of Sewell, New Jersey to make the cut. Steve Novak would lead the qualifying rounds going into Sunday by 11 pins with a score +149. Scores would rise in the stepladder finals.



Daugherty wins RPI at Strike It Big Oviedo Open

Tom Daugherty wins 19th career Regional title at the strike it big over the open. This was another RPI qualifier he defeated Ryan Ciminelli 234 to 221. Daugherty was not eligible for the RPI qualifier because he was in the top 50 of the Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour. The other spots went to Ryan Ciminelli, Gary Faulkner, Mike Coffey and Sean Connolly. For the Regional Players invitational spots John Janawicz was not eligible because he was not a PBA member. In the semi-finals it was high scoring match as Tom Daugherty defeated Gary Faulkner 268 to 242. In the first match was a low scoring match as Gary Faulkner defeated USBC Hall of Famer John Janawicz 203 to 199. Ryan Ciminelli would average 235 in the preliminary rounds.



Moment in History: The Third Player to earn a million in career earnings

In 1976 Marshall Holman became the youngest player to win the Tournament of Champions. Fast forward ten years later he had not made the televised finals in the previous nine tournaments. He was looking to become the third player to earn a million dollars in career earnings. Mike Aulby, Don Genalo, Mark Baker, and Del Warren were the other finalists that made the top five in the stepladder finals. Mike Aulby was looking to win his third major but fell a little bit short in his third match to Don Genalo. Mark Baker had really dominated the previous two matches. Holman became the sixth player in PBA history to win 20 PBA Tour titles. In the championship games both players were struggling as Holman missed a two pin and Baker had fouled. However he would make his spare. Baker had made a match out of it by striking in the critical frames. In addition he was looking to become the fifth player in the Tournament of Champions to win the tournament twice. The other four were Mike Durbin, Earl Anthony, Dave Davis and Jim Godman. Baker had a chance to double in the tenth to force Holman to perform to win his second TOC. Holman stated at the end of the show this was his greatest moments and that he would have pair of matching trophies.

First PBA Bowler to bowl a 300 game on Television passes away



On October 6, 2021 Jack Biondolillo passed away due to dementia with complicating kidney failure. Jack Biondolillo was famous for bowling the first perfect game on television at the 1967 Tournament of Champions. Where he defeated Les Schisser 300-216 in front of 15 million viewers earning \$10,000 for the perfect game. He would be defeated by Don Johnson 228 to 172 who would hold the #1 greatest moment in PBA history in the infamous 299. Biondolillo would win three PBA Tour titles with one of them being a doubles title with USBC Hall of Famer Don Ellis. His last showing at a PBA Tour event was in the Super Bowl. Where Parker Bohn III, Jason Belmonte, Norm Duke and Pete McCordic. Pete had earned a \$100,000 for his perfect game. Jack Biondolillo had made to Texas State Hall of Fame and Houston Hall of Fame. This moment would be ranked 12th in the 60 greatest moments in the history of the PBA. He will be remembered as the first bowler to achieve a 300 in front of mass television audience. A first major moment for the PBA. Biondolillo was setting the bar for future PBA membership to shoot a 300 on national television

national television.





Hello Subscribers to the Josh Hyde's Bowling Newsletter. This past season of the Josh Hyde Bowling Newsletter there was a number of things happening in the world of bowling. #1. Tommy Jones became the third player to bowl a 300 in the title match in the PBA Hall of Fame classic. He also joined Mike Durbin winning the same week that he was inducted the PBA Hall of Fame. Kyle Troup has the most earnings for one year at this point almost half a million dollars. Jason Belmonte became the second player in PBA history to win every major by winning the 2020 US Open. Liz Johnson & Jason Belmonte would become the Bowler's of the Decade in the 2010's. Jason Belmonte had a major dominance in the last decade. Josey Barnes became the first woman to earn a \$100,000 by winning the 2021 U.S. Open. The scores were high at the USBC Open Championships as Chris Via would become the All-Events Champion. He also would win the 2021 U.S Open by defeating by one pin over Jakob Butturff. Anthony Neur would become the fourth player to convert the 7-10 split on National Television. Sean Rash and Francis Lavoie would be joined by Chris Via as the only players to bowl multiple perfect games on National Television. Parker Bohn III had an outstanding as he would win a combination of four PBA50 regional titles or PBA50 Tour titles in just ten days. The last two weeks of the PBA50 tour season Tom Hess & Chris Barnes would go at in the PBA Senior US Open and the USBC Senior Master with Hess coming behind and becoming the PBA50 Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year. On a personal note I would be adding four more 300's to my bowling resume and a couple more 800 series with a 300 game. In two days I had three 300's and both of those came with 800 series. On another personal note I would like to dedicate this to my grandfather Phillip Wayne Smith as he would pass away in the mid-spring. To my family I love you and thank you for being there for me.
