PBA50 Award Winners

Parker Bohn III joined an elite group for winning both PBA & PBA50 Player of the Year honors. He joins Walter Ray Williams Jr, Amleto Monacelli and Wayne Webb. Bohn won four titles including two Majors. He also became the fourth bowler to earn ten PBA Tour & ten PBA50 Tour titles.

After winning a Major title at the 2022 Florida Blue Medicare PBA50 National Championship in April, Bohn III said "to win this early in the season, hopefully it will propel me to go on and win two or three more times before the season is done."

Dino Castillo won the 2022 USBC Senior Masters. He bowled 300 in the first match of the championship round beating Chris Barnes. Castillo would go on to defeat Chris Warren twice because Warren had to be beaten twice to lose the title.

Dino said "the defining moment of his season was winning the Senior Masters because his wife and his best friends were there" to witness his victory.

Castillo finished fifth in the points race on the PBA50 Tour for his rookie season. The top five bowlers in points and earnings are as follows Parker Bohn III, Chris Barnes, Brad Angelo, Tom Hess and Dino Castillo.

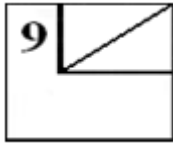

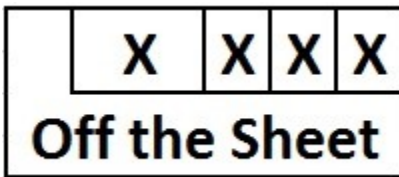


PBA Announces Advisory Board

Last month, the PBA announced the Advisory Board Certification Program. The Board is made up of three people plus a PBA Hall of Famer. This board will decide on the PBA League Bowler program in the upcoming season. **Bowlero** already has 180,000 league bowlers across the United States. The board consists of Lori Mraz of **Turbo Bowling** who has been a bowling industry leader for decades. Parker Bohn III is a world-renowned PBA and USBC Hall of Famer. Chris Chartrand joined **Kegel** in 1999 bringing more innovation to the company. Charlie Mitchell owns **Bayside Bowl** in Portland, Maine where it hosts the PBA League Tournaments.

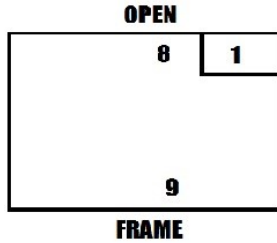


Belmo earns Team Captain for BJI's All-American Team

Jason Belmonte had a good season becoming the first bowler to win three PBA Players Championships. He became the third bowler in PBA history to bowl two perfect games on national television. This is why he earned this prestigious honor. The other bowlers that made the team are Kris Prather, Dom Barrett, Anthony Simonsen, and Shawn Maldonado. Anthony Simonsen became the youngest player to win three Majors at the 2022 U.S Open. A few tournaments later, he would earn his second Masters Title by defeating Norm Duke. Dom Barrett became the eighth bowler to complete the Triple Crown at the 2022 Tournament of Champions. Sean Maldonado would receive his first BJI All-American Team. For instance, the Spare/Strike Pillar Clinic discusses the four basic elements of bowling: Knowledge of the Sport, Physical Game, Lane Play and Ball Dynamics. This clinic goes in-depth as to the impact each pillar has to a bowler's success on the lanes.

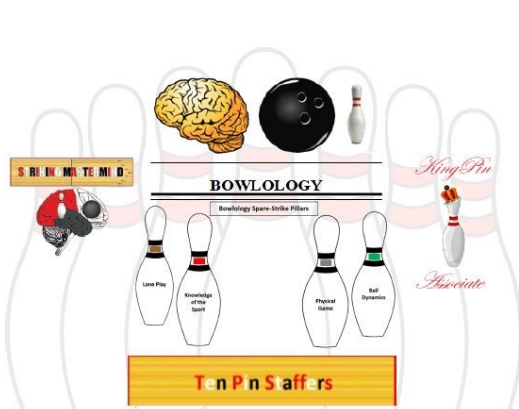

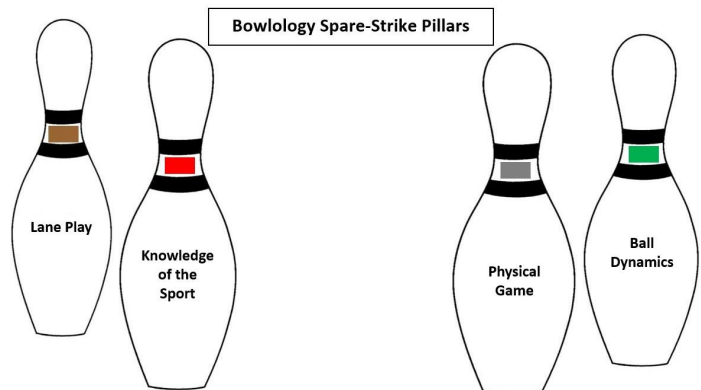

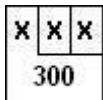

A proposal to the International Bowling Media Association

The editor of the Josh Hyde’s Bowling Newsletter has won 16 awards from the International Bowling Media Association. I plan to make a proposal to IBMA President Mark Miller. The proposal would entail a writing competition in which the bowling writers would be given a topic to explain or contemplate. An example could include the different two handed bowling styles of Belmonte and Simonsen. Another topic could be the importance of teaching a first-time bowler a basic four step approach. A challenging topic could be the best way to reliably strike on new lane conditions in a different bowling center. Lane play on the tournament conditions, keeping score, shooting spares and ball dynamics could all be different topics for us to write about.

Last month, I received a letter from the International Bowling Media Association President. He stated on how he wants to further strengthen relations with the Bowling Proprietors Association and the USBC. It is great to grow this organization, however bowling writers have to know why Jason Belmonte might change the ball in the middle of the game. A big part of bowling writing is being able to know what the bowler might think while he or she is performing. In pro-tournaments, the bowlers use at least one to three qualifying rounds to improve their score. For a bowling writer, it is important to understand what bowlers are struggling with. If they missed spares in their qualifying games, it is hard to make that spare up in one game.
