## USBC Hall of Fame 2024 Announced

Last month the USBC announced the 2024 Hall of Fame class. The class included a PBA Hall of Famer Roy Buckley, Jodi Woessner, Debbie Kuhn, Darlene Baker and Brian Waliczek. This class will be inducted on April 24th during the 2024 USBC Convention.

Debbie Kuhn of Maryland was a three time member of Team USA. She also won titles at the USBC women's championship. She also claimed gold as a team USA member. Bowling Digest Magazine Amateur Woman Bowler of the Year in 1999. Debbie Kuhn has proven herself to be in the USBC Hall of Fame.

Jodi Woessner of Oregon, Ohio has had a great bowling career. She has won the USBC Senior Queens and has set the All-Events record averaging 258. She is one of five bowlers who have a perfect game and a 800 series in the USBC Women's Championships. Woessner has been a dominant force throughout her bowling career.

Roy Buckley won a total of 7 PBA National Titles. He is a PBA Hall of Famer. Buckley has also performed at the Open Championships. Where he captured two Eagles in the 70's. Unfortunately Buckley passed away a couple of years. He was on the Bowlers Journal All-American Team for 75-76. Buckley captured six of seven titles in the 70's.

Brian Waliczek has captured four Eagles. When Waliczek won his fourth Eagle he averaged 249 with a 750 high series for his nine game total. Waliczek won the team all event titles. His first title came at the 2015 Open Championships in the Team Event. He is currently sixth on the Championships Lifetime average list.

Darlene Baker the last inductee may have not performed on the lanes but has outperformed off the lanes. She was first woman to serve as the USBC besides multiple other positions within the organization. She was also a "key participant in the creation of the USBC back in 2005"along with being "member of the volunteer tournament staff at the USBC Junior Gold Championships" for over ten years. Darlene has assisted with numerous bowling charities and being included in several bowling hall of fames.

## Tenth Frame Editorial: Player of the Year Pick

What a Player of the Year race for the 2023 Chris Schenkel Player of the Year Award. EJ Tackett led all three with winning two of the three Major tournaments of the Triple Crown. This includes doubling in the 10th against Jason Belmonte to win the PBA World Championship. EJ is also winning a consecutive high average award. In the history of the PBA there has been no season like it. It was Simonsen, Belmonte, and Tackett that owned the PBA Tour. It was a reminder of the era with Earl Anthony, Mark Roth, Marshall Holman back in the 1970s and 80s. Indeed Belmonte is the only bowler to bowl three perfect games on television and the only bowler to win the Tournament of Champions four times. It might have been his only title in 2023 and it is another Major in his stellar career.

Anthony Simonsen keeps being the youngest player to win majors being the third player in USBC history to win the Masters three times in addition to that he also become the third player to successfully defend the USBC Masters. Simonsen was in the top 10 for most of the 2023 season and was always a contender for the top. In some ways this matchup is similar to 1991 when David Ozio won the AC Delco and Showboat in the first two weeks of the season. The remainder of the season had other players who rose up and tried to claim the award. It seems like EJ will do the same for 2023. Had EJ Tackett not won two majors it might have a been a threeway tie for Player of the Year.

This was a dominating year that Tackett, Belmonte, and Simonsen put on for the PBA fans.
