Messenger: 2024 Chris Schenkel Player of the Year

EJ Tackett earned his third Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year honor. Tackett joined Earl Anthony, Walter Ray Williams Jr, Mark Roth and Jason Belmonte at becoming the fifth player in PBA History to earn three Player of the Year honors. He also joined Walter Ray Williams Jr, Amelto Monacelli, Don Johnson, Mark Roth, Earl Anthony and Jason Belmonte to earn back to back Player of the Year honors. Tackett won two titles at the PBA World Series of Bowling with the Shark Championship and earning his fifth major at the PBA World Championship.

"Everything has clicked together the last two seasons," Tackett said. "I've been able to make the right moves at the right time, maybe a little bit quicker than most.

Tackett also made five consecutive championship round appearances. He would also claim the George Young High Average Award coming up ten pins shy of Jason Belmonte record. EJ would need to shoot 299 in the last game of competition to surpass Jason Belmonte. He would end up shooting a 289 coming up short. Tackett also joins Mike Aulby and Jason Belmonte as the player who has earned both multiple Player of the Year honors and Rookie of the Year honors.





















Messenger Continued: 2024 PBA Awards Announced

The 2024 Harry Golden Rookie of the Year was won by Nate Purches. Nate had already earned success by finishing second at the PBA Junior National Championship in 2021. Nate Purches would receive slightly more than 70% of the PBA Membership. He earned a season-high finish of seventh in the PBA Cheetah Championship and a season-high major finish of 12th in the PBA World Championship.

"It felt like everything that I worked for — the dedication, the effort — everything all felt completed at that moment in time," Purches said of hearing the news.



Nate earned the PBA Midwest Region Rookie of the Year Honors and Midwest Region Player of the Year in 2023.

Richie Teece earned the 2024 Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award Winner earned 26% of the vote out of a nine player field. Tommy Jones came in second with 19% followed by Jake Peters at 13%.

"It's awesome being recognized by your peers," Teece said. "I try to be happy all the time and make things positive. It makes for a generally better environment on the tour."


Kyle Troup received the 2024 Tony Reyes Community Service Award. The award recognizes a current PBA Member who does charitable service work. Kyle hosts a Christmas No-Tap Fundraiser in Jeffersontown, KY where he is raised more than \$17,500. Troup has raised nearly \$40,000 in North Carolina and Kentucky.

"To join the list of people (who have won this award) and see the caliber of what they've done for their organizations, I'm honored to be a part of the group," Troup said.



Spare Column– Roger Hyde Memorial Tournament

This past December 8th, forty-one bowlers participated in First Annual Roger Hyde Memorial Tournament at Warsaw Bowl. The tournament was named in honor of Roger Hyde who passed away on March 20th, 2024. Roger Hyde was a local pro-shop operator and a very serious amateur bowler. He loved tournaments that bowlers had to make their spares and keep the ball in play. In 1996, Roger Hyde would get to bowl in the US Open as an amateur winning the amateur part of the tournament. In 2005, he would be an inductee of the Warsaw B.A./USBC Hall of Fame. Hyde bowled nearly thirty 300s and numerous 800 series.

Those 41 bowlers were vying for a top prize of \$500.00. Burl Haywood, the proprietor of Warsaw Bowl, would donate \$100.00 to the prize fund. Travis Reneker would donate a trophy to the winner of the tournament. The tournament was on the Mark Roth 42-foot pattern. The field was comprised of several accomplished bowlers such as a PBA Regional champion, a High Roller champion, a past Central Region Rookie-of-the-Year. In the first game, 2024 Indiana Scratch Classic champion Ryan Burton fired a perfect 300 game.

The tournament format was a 6-game qualifying squad with each bowler crossing each pair of lanes. After qualifying, the field was cut to the top 8. Those bowlers would then bowl a cashiers round to determine the four finalists who would bowl in a round robin format. The four finalists would bowl four games of round robin with the last game being the position round. Bowlers winning their games would receive 30 bonus pins in addition to their plus or minus score.

In the cashiers round, Bailey Maverick would receive the top spot for the round robin finals. It would take a score of 196 by eventual champion Scott Tapley. Jeffery Grego and Tim Logan would be the other two finalists that would get to bowl in the round robin finals. The round robin finals would see all four bowlers bowling on the same pair of lanes switching lanes after each game. The first game saw Bailey Maverick take an early lead as he would bowl a 241. Next, Scott Tapley would make a statement by firing a 236 while Bailey Maverick would struggle with a 187 game. In the third game, Jeff Grego would have a 245 game but would be beat by two pins. In the final game, Scott Tapley would come out on top as he would only lose one game in the round robin finals.

Thanks to all of the bowlers who came out and bowled in the Roger Hyde Memorial Tournament. Thanks to Brunswick for donating two bowling balls and to Andy Kiser who was the tournament director. Also, thanks to Marsha Miller and Jan Stump from the Warsaw B.A. USBC for coming to the tournament. Last, but certainly not least, a special thank you to Warsaw Bowl for hosting the tournament.
