Mark Clark won the PBA50 WSOB by defeating Chris Barnes 245 to 223. Clark earned \$25,000 for his efforts in the PBA50 WSOB.

"It's nuts that I just bowled Chris Barnes for a major title, and I won." said Mark after his win.

In the other matches, John Janawicz was trying to become the first and only PBA50 bowler to win all five majors on the PBA50 Tour. In the first match, he beat Tom Hess when he shot 290 over Tom Hess's 190. The next match saw Tom Daugherty take on John Janawicz. It was a closer match. John Janawicz kept on climbing the ladder by defeating Tom Daugherty 258 to 236. Chris Barnes and John Janawicz had a low scoring match with Barnes winning 214 to 202. Other finishers in the World Series of Bowling were Pete Weber, Mika Koivuniemi, Brad Angelo and Tom Hess.





## Past PBA President passes away



