On December 11th thru the 14th a 149 bowlers will be competing for the 2025 Regional Players Invitational Tournament for PBA & PBA50. The Tournament will be held at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada. The PBA50 Regional Invitational will be compete for a top prize of \$10,000. For the PBA \$15,000 each winner will receive an entry to the 2026 Tournament of Champions. Below is the list of bowlers that will be competing at the Regional Players Invitational.

Fourteen players from each of the seven PBA Regional Tours (East, Central, Midwest, South, Southwest, West and Northwest) will qualify for the event, including 10 from each region's points list and four from each region's RPI qualifier event.

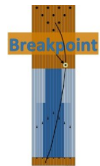

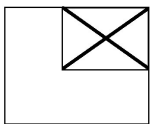
Breakpoint: 42nd 900 Series

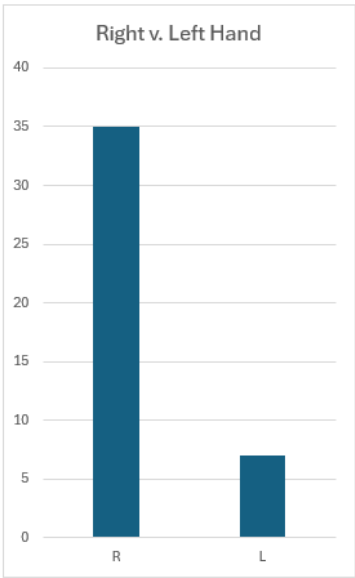
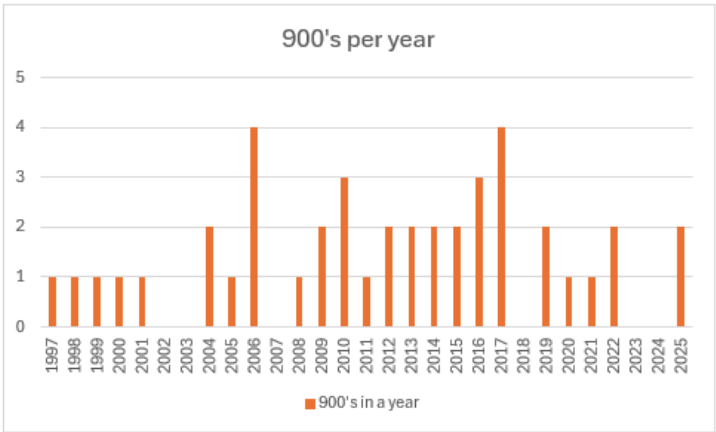
On November 10th, 2025 Andrew Granite of Elvirita, California bowled the 42nd 900 series at Country Club Lanes in Sacramento. Andrew’s goal was to raise his average in order to do this he had to shoot a series of 720 on this league session. In order to accomplish the goal Andrew would have to strike 21 out of the 30 instead he would strike 36 times. “Getting the second 300 was wild in itself because I’d never done it before,” Granite said . As Granite got closer to 900 he would pace back and forth after he shot but at the last frame he just followed through. “I honestly don’t know what was going through my head during that last frame,”.

Granite has become the fourth bowler of California to roll a 900 series and the 42nd overall in the nation.



Strike Column: 900 Series Analysis

On July 1, 1982, Glenn Allison shot the first 900 series in bowling history. However, USBC did not recognize the accomplishment because of non-compliant lane conditions. There are a number of bowling critics who would argue otherwise. The first sanctioned 900 series was shot by Jeremy Sonnenfeld on Feb 2, 1997. In recent years there have been more shot. There has only been one bowler to achieve this feat twice, Robert Mushtare. Interestingly, there has not been a two-handed bowler that has accomplished this feat.

Top Prize: \$1000 (based on 40 entries). The last cash prize will be a minimum of \$150.

Oil Pattern: On reverse side

Format: Bowl 6 games across 12 lanes with the top 8 (based on 40 entries) advancing to the elimination round. All scores will be dropped.

Elimination Rd: The top 8 will be placed into groups of 4 based on qualifying. Group 1 (Seeds 1,4,5,8) and group 2 (Seeds 2,3,6,7). Those groups will bowl 2 games with the top 2 bowlers in each group advancing to the step ladder finals. Scores used in the elimination round will determine the seeding for the step ladder.

Step Ladder Finals: Single game matches until a winner is determined.

Youth bowlers are eligible with all earnings added to their Smart account.

Tournament directors will have a final say in all disputes.

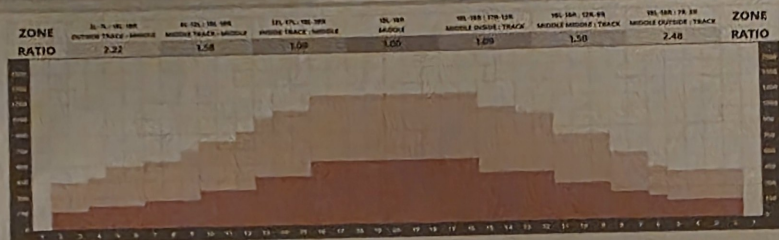

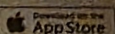
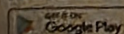

Fantasy Bowling League

The start of the 2026 PBA Tour Season offers the opportunity to also start a Fantasy Bowling League. Bowling fans will be challenged to assemble five bowlers into a team. It will run for the whole season and include any event which generates PBA Points. The goal is to have the highest “return” for the selected players.

An individual will have the opportunity to select five of the top 100 players from the 2025 season. These players will “cost” their points from the 2025 season and the goal is to earn more points in the 2026 season. The regular PBA events, the PBA World, the Tournament of Champions, and the Players Championship will be the schedule. The two Majors which will not be added are the US Open and the Masters because they do not have points.

Please return your team selection by February 15, 2026. As the 2026 season progresses, a monthly list of teams and points will be published in the newsletter and on the website.
