

Strike Column - Father and Son PBA Hall-of-Famers

Both Pete and Dick Weber are legends in the sport of bowling. They both are in the PBA Hall of Fame and the USBC Hall of Fame. Together, they have 9 U.S. Open titles (formerly BPAA All Stars). Pete has 5 U.S. Open titles. These two bowlers know how to get 10 pins down in one shot.

Dick Weber was the first superstar of the PBA. He paved the way for bowlers to make a living by throwing a bowling ball. Weber was the first bowler to win a title in five different decades. This shows how great he really was. In his PBA career, Weber had one Player of the Year award and one High Average award. He became the first bowler to win three tournaments in-a-row. However, they were in two different seasons. Still, he won.

Dick Weber was an intimidating player on the lanes. He was one of the first players to hook the ball. In his era, nobody could do this better than Weber. In the earlier years of the PBA, many PBA members would leave a lot of 5pins—except Dick Weber, who figured out how to knock it down. Players would be envious of Weber, because it looked like Weber would not have a chance, but then he would strike. To become a great bowler, the player must take advantage of the breaks that present themselves, which is what Weber did.

Pete Weber was a bowler like his father, but he was not Dick Weber. At first, bowling fans were reluctant to embrace him because of his antics on the lanes. However, he could still get the job done. He is one of the best bowlers on today's PBA tour. He is the best bowler without a PBA Player of the Year to his credit. With five U.S. Open titles, no one can debate that Weber is a great bowler. In fact, his last ball for his 5th U.S. Open title was probably the greatest strike that bowling fans ever witnessed. He became just the third bowler to win the Triple Crown, which consists of the U.S. Open, the PBA World Championship, and the Tournament of Champions. To have all three of these titles is something to be proud of. Only six bowlers have accomplished that feat.

During the phone interview just after he tied his father with 26 titles, Pete asked his father on TV how he was doing in the PBA50 Tournament. During the PBA50 championship, Dick said he qualified for the casher's round. Pete said "come on now and become the first player to win a title in six different decades."

Pete Weber's first major title was at the 1987 Tournament of Champions. To have that for the first major is quite an achievement. It showed that Weber could definitely bowl and win in the Majors. In 2013, Pete Weber made PBA history by becoming the first player to capture the Triple Crown twice. Just the year before, he become the first bowler to win 5 US Opens. Also in 2013, he became the first player to capture the Rookie of the year on both the PBA and the PBA50 Tours. Pete Weber has won 10 titles with plastic, urethane, resin, and particle bowling balls showing his versatility as a bowler.

Dick and Pete Weber are the best father-son combination the PBA has ever seen. These bowlers know how to strike in the most challenging tournaments the PBA has to offer. Both bowlers know how to strike in the tenth to win a title. This makes the Webers two of the top bowlers in PBA history.

At the PBA50 Pro Bowl West tournaments, I had the privilege of selling my book. I created a PBA Media Guide for the 2012-13 PBA Tour season with special features. I also was able to write a media kit for the 2015 Tournament of Champions.


My dream has been fulfilled for being able to provide information to be a part of the PBA tournaments. Allin-all, it was a great bowling year for me.

2015 Bowling's U.S. Open

On December 11, 2014, bowl.com announced that there will be a 2015 US Men's and Women's Open. AMF BowlMor will be the title sponsor for the tournament. The Tournament will feature 3 rounds of 8 games with the top 1/3 advancing to the casher's round. Those bowlers will come back and bowl 8 more games of qualifying. Then, the field will be cut to the top 24. The top 24 bowlers will bowl 24 games of round robin match play. After a total of 56 games, the fields will be cut at the top 5. For the televised stepladder final, a top prize of \$50,000 will be awarded to the winner. Log onto bowl.com for more information.




Matt Russo bowls with PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III in the members/non-members PBA Regional doubles at the 6th PBA WSOB.

Pepe Wins in Fashion at the Cheetah PBA Mobile Challenge

In the Cheetah PBA Mobile Challenge opening round, the scores were high taking a score of +280 by Liz Johnson to claim the last spot in the semi-finals. It took a score of + 249 by Joe Findling to earn the last cash spot. Dick Allen led the first round of qualifying with a score of + 369, that is averaging 252 for the first 7 games of qualifying. There were a total of four perfect games during the course of the tournament, including one from the eventual champion Anthony Pepe.

In the second round of qualifying, Dick Allen kept charging to claim the top spot. Johnson was trying to become the first woman to make PBA history, by making multiple television shows on the PBA Tour. She did that by being the last person to make the cut, then going on to make the championship round. Another bowler was trying to make history by winning his first title at the PBA World Series of Bowling. Anthony Pepe qualified third to make the Championship round. Brad Angelo came back from injuries to qualify second. PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber just missed the championship round by 19 pins. It came down to the last frame.

The championship round was set with Dick Allen, Brad Angelo, Anthony Pepe, and Liz Johnson. Three bowlers - Brad Angelo, Anthony Pepe and Liz Johnson were featured in the first game. Pepe made PBA history as he became the first bowler to shoot a 295 to win the first game. Pepe would defeat Angelo's 226 and Johnson's 224. This would setup the championship match with Anthony Pepe and Dick Allen. Dick Allen could never get anything going as he left a couple of splits late in the game. This would propel Pepe to win his first PBA Tour title.



Ball Reviews

These ball reviews are from PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III. Below are his comments about both new balls from Brunswick, the leader in bowling ball technology.

Fortera Intrigue- This ball is "more mellow and best for lighter oil. It will not be as jumpy on the back end of the lane when the ball changes direction. It is not as angular as the Melee Jab. The ball will go though the pins with plenty of punch," stated Parker. Melee Jab- "This ball has strong angular motion as it goes down the lanes . At the end of the lane it goes through the pins with a ton of authority," stated Parker. He also recommended that it is a "highly productive ball to keep in a bowler's arsenal."




In this section, a topic will be picked based on the bowling knowledge of Josh Hyde.

Ball Motion - Part 2

Last month, Bowlology covered the skid, hook, and roll parts of a ball's travel down the lane to the pins. This month's article goes further with three different types of ball motion phases.

A bowler must select the right phase for the length of the pattern. These three different phases will help the bowler decide what they want to accomplish. In the early phase, the ball's motion has more hook, less skid, and more roll. This phase would be best for

the Badger pattern. The next phase is called the late ball motion phase which has more skid and more hook. It has little to no roll at all. This phase would be would be good for the Wolf pattern. The bowler would want the ball to skid more and be more angular at the backend. The last one is called the optimal phase., being a combination of all three. This would be best used for a medium length condition where a bowler would encounter all three of these features. For more information, bowlers are encouraged to discuss ball motion with their pro-shop operator.


