Last month announced the rest of the 2016-2017 ESPN television schedule it all starts with the PBA World championship on December 11th at 1:00PM. It will be on live television, a week later the first of the four animal pattern championships will start at this year's PBA World Series of Bowling. The Fire Lake Bowling Center in Shawnee, Oklahoma will once again host the Tournament of Champions. In July of 2017 the Fire Lake Bowling Center will run two live shows on July 1st and July 2nd with the semi-finals and the finals further details will be discussed at a later date. During the eight World Series of Bowling the PBA is hosting a show involving the US vs the World. The top five during all portions of qualifying of the WSOB will be facing off in a Team competition. Once again the PBA will offer three straight weeks of live major bowling starting on February 19th with Barbasol PBA Players Championship. A week later the PBA titlist will once again get a chance to win second jewel in probowling at the Fire Lake PBA Tournament of Champions. Finally the USBC Masters will take place on February 26th. On April 16th the Mark Roth/Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship. It will also be a live broadcast. Lastly the Elias Cup will start on April 21st. The championship for the Elias Cup will be on May 14th at 1 PM.

Brunswick has returned the Quantum bowling ball line. It originally was on the lanes in 1994 through 2000 and features the same mushroom style core as the first balls. Pro shop operators will not have to be certified to drill these balls unlike the ones from 1994-2000. Brunswick started the tour edition balls through the Quantum line like the Sage Quantum and the Sage Tour Edition Quantum. It was the same ball, but with a longer length.

The new balls have 3.5 times the coverstock which should increase performance on the lanes. The addition allows more kinetic energy to get transferred to the pins which increases pin action. These two balls deliver ball reactions that bowlers can use on everyday lane conditions. The Fire Quantum is for skid flip and the Solid Quantum is for heavier oil. A comment from Parker Bohn III, "If you want to get in and watch a ball make a turn in such a way 'that's the ball for me'" and "Put this ball in my hand"

PBA Wolf Open—Recap

The scores were quite high at the 2016 PBA Fall Swing at the Wolf Open. There were a total of 6 300 shots during the tournament. The cut took a score of +170 by PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke to make it into the next round. Chris Barnes led the first 6 games with a score of +268. He was one of the bowlers that shot a 300 game. In the second round 2016 PBA Rookie of the Year candidate Francis Lavoie led it by 76 pins over three time Chris Schenkel Player of the Year Jason Belmonte. Chris Barnes dropped two places down to make him the third seeded for the stepladder finals. The other two bowlers were Tom Daugherty and 2016 USBC Master Champion Anthony Simonsen.

In the first match Anthony Simonsen was having a hard time hitting the pocket as well as having a gutter ball in the eighth frame. It was a low scoring affair with Daugherty winning 198 to 183. In the second match, it looked like Daugherty was going to win the match easily as he struck three out of the first four frames. However Barnes opened the three out of the first four frames. In the second frame Barnes made a 2-10 split. Barnes began to strike after struggling in the first part of the game. Daugherty was beginning to struggle and had a chance to double in the tenth to shut out Barnes. Tom got 19 in the tenth giving Barnes a second life to double and advance. Barnes could not get the double to advance in the tenth frame. In the semi-finals Daugherty has been undefeated against Jason Belmonte. Tom started with a front six against Jason Belmonte. Belmonte kept up with Tom but in the middle of the game, Jason was beginning to struggle. Jason could have put some pressure on Tom but he could not. As Tom only needed a mark in the tenth to win the game and keep his record of being undefeated

PBA Bear Open

E.J. Tackett led the qualifying round with a score of +246. Only Jason Sterner made the round of 12 from the Wolf Open for the Bear. It took a score of +121 by Shawn Maldonado to advance to the round of 12. The 2015 Harry Golden Rookie of the Year recipient, Jesper Svensson, qualified 7th with a score of +137. There were only 25 pins separating 12th through 5th place. In the round of 12, Svensson took the lead with a score of +306. Rhion Page dropped from 3rd to 12th place in the semifinals. Three former Rookies of the Year qualified for the top 5 spots in the step ladder finals—Svensson, Tackett, and Blanchard. Jon Van Hees scored a +197, which is what it took to make the step ladder finals.

In the first match of the PBA Bear Open, Jon Van Hees had a hard time getting lined up to the pocket. John Szcerbinski avoided trouble and made his spares. Szcerbinski did not give Van Hees a chance by doubling in the 10th.

In the second match, Szcerbinski started with the front five while
Blanchard left the 4-7 whiffing the spare in the first frame. Things got a little interesting as John left the 410 split in the 6th frame. It looked like Josh was going to have a chance, but John made the 4-10 split.
Then Szcerbinski made another difficult spare with the 1-2-6-8-10. John was putting a spare clinic.
Blanchard could never rise to the occasion as he struggled with a 184 game. Szcerbinski shot a 234 advancing to the semifinals to face E.J. Tackett.

The semifinals was an interesting match where E.J. could have shut out John. As it played out, E.J. missed the 3-6-9-10 spare giving John a chance to step up and fill 20 in the 10th to win by one pin. The first ball John threw in the 10th was the 2-8-10 split which he did not convert. As it turned out, the score was 193-184.

Jesper Svensson and E.J. Tackett met in the championship match. E.J. started out slow having rolling back-to-back splits. It looked like that Svensson was going to win his 6th career PBA Tour title. Svenssen struggled late in the game, while E.J. was finding the pocket. Jesper started out strong, but missed a couple of spares—leaving the 1-3-7 in the 3rd frame, then chopping the 10 off the 6 in the 6th frame. Jesper came back strong in the 8th and 9th by doubling. In the tenth frame, he could only fill 19. E.J. was behind the whole match, but then struck 5 of the last 6 frames to claim his 3rd career PBA Tour title.

PBA Badger Open

The Badger Open took a score of +127 by Martin Larsen to make the round of 12. Wes Malott took the lead with a score of +264. Some of the other names that were that made the cut were Sean Rash, Jason Belmonte, Graham Fach, and Rhino Page.

Rookie of the Year candidate Graham Fach was able to leap into third place by shooting +201 to make the stepladder finals. Jason Belmonte was able to keep on and sneak into fifth. Meanwhile Wes Malott kept on striking by shooting +169 to maintain the lead for the championship round. Thomas Larsen and Rhino Page were the only threats to Jason Belmonte. The other bowlers were too far out to make a run after the 12 games of qualifying. Francis Lavoie and Graham Fach rounded out the top 5 that made the stepladder. Both of these bowlers are battling for the Rookie of the Year honors. The Badger Open was setup with former Player of the Year and possibly Rookie of the Year. The championship round was setup for the best 2016 PBA season.

Belmonte started out strong in position four out the five. The struggle started in the second part of the game as Belmo could not seal the deal. However Francis Lavoie took advantage of the game by striking in seventh, eight, and ninth. He had a chance to win the game by doubling in the tenth or filing in the 20 in the tenth. He could only muster up a spare and nine, by losing by one pin 226 to 225.

In the second match featured three time Player of the Year Jason Belmonte and Graham Fach. Belmo started off strong but ran into transition, leaving a number of open frames. Fach was able to capitalize by striking the last five frames to score 249. Belmonte could only muster up a 161. The semi-finals featured Graham Fach and Sean Rash who got off striking with the front four with Fach being dutch. This time however Rash got his striking shoes on and went on a striking frenzy, but he whiffed a ten pin in the tenth frame. For Fach, it was too little too late. Rash won 224 to 205 over Fach. The next match featured two former Player of the Year, Sean Rash and Wes Malott. Once again Rash got off with a great start while Malott struggled to find his mark. He threw a couple off shots, but Rash was able to preserve and claim his tenth PBA Tour title. Rash defeated Malott 259 to 195.

PBA Detroit Open

In the PBA Detroit Open, the 18 game cash took a score of +263 by Andres Gomez. There was a tie for 17th place between Bill O'Neill and Tom Smallwood with a score of +329. 2016 Rookie of the Year candidate Francis Lavoie led the qualifying with a score of +597. Lavoie led second place by 61 pins over Wes Malott. Some of the other names who made the round of 18 were Jason Belmonte, Sean Rash, E.J. Tackett, Tommy Jones, Jesper Svensson, among others.

The round of 18 six games on the Wolf, Bear, and Badger patterns. The Fall Swing did not see any match play. It was simple pinfall totals. After each round, the PBA re-positioned the field into different crossing. The Detroit Open was mostly about saving themselves, making spares, catching a double, and a bagger of some sort. There were no perfect games in the Open. E.J. Tackett was the number with a score of +745 while Jason Belmonte was the leader with +1077. Being the leader, he had the choice of patters for the step-ladder televised finals and he chose the Bear pattern.

E.J. started out strong with the front four and converted the 2-4-8-10 in the fifth frame. Meanwhile, Daughtery could not get anything going and was leaving difficult spare shots. E.J. won 231-159. In the next match, Malott and Tacket

started with an open frame. Neither player get lined up and strike. E.J. needed a double in the tenth to win, but he only managed a spare-strike and lost 201-195. The next match saw two former Player of the Years. It looked like Wes was going to take Sean Rash down, but he back-to-back opens in the 7th and 8th frames. Rash struck out on his last four and won 202-198. In the Championship match, the reigning Player of the Year Jason Belmonte started off with a whiff on the 7 pin while Rash had an average game. Jason had a double in the 2nd and 3rd, but had more trouble later and could not rebound from his mistakes. Rash won his 11th career PBA title by the 9th frame with a score of 178-161. During his interview, Rash made a point that the tournament was about making spares and not about scoring high.

In the first match, Malott faced Belmonte. Both players were struggling during the entire match. Belmonte gave Malott a chance by filling 20 in the 10th. Unfortunately, Malott left the 2-8-10 on the first ball in the 10th frame. Belmonte won 199-185.

The second match saw the Wolf Open champion Tom Daugherty take on Jason Belmonte. Once again, Belmonte gave Daugherty a chance to strike out in the 10th frame and win by one pin. Unfortunately, Daugherty left the 4-pin on the first ball in the 10th frame and Belmonte advanced by a final score of 219-208.

The semifinals featured the 2012-2013 Rookie-of-the-Year and the reigning Player-of-the-Year. Both players got off to a striking start. Belmonte struggled in the middle of the game while E.J. was staying clean by making his spares and avoiding trouble on the lanes. Belmonte, with his open frames, failed to challenge Tackett to perform in the 10th frame. The final score was 226-194.
